Outline

The “European Transport Research and Innovation Week” (ETRIW) will be a Pan-European action concentrating main transport research activities. It will create the meeting opportunity for the key EU transport research associations, Networks of Excellence, Technology Platforms in transport and the EU representatives. The idea follows the „French EU Presidency Event – Sustainable Transport & Mobility Research and Climate Change Challenge“, held in Lyon, 8 - 12 December 2008.

The basic aim is to support in the framework of the Czech EU Presidency the extension of the European transport research area across the whole Europe, particularly with the non-EU countries. During the European Transport Research and Innovation Week, meetings of several European transport research associations and signatories of the Lyon Declaration will be held.

The European Conference of Transport Research Institutes (ECTRI) is an international non-profit organisation that was founded in April 2003. Its members are 20 major transport research institutes and universities from 17 European countries. Together, they account for more than 3,000 European scientific and research staff in the field of transport research. ECTRI aims to help building the «European Research Area» (ERA) in surface transport by cooperation in 8 thematic and 3 process oriented working groups, task forces, Framework Programme projects and seminars.

Each two years, ECTRI also organises jointly with FEHRL and FERSI, Young Researchers Seminars aiming at training through tutorial young researchers in their oral and written scientific presentations (next Seminar scheduled in Torino, Italy, 3-5 June 2009).

ECTRI had also launched the multidisciplinary scientific journal "European Transport Research Review" (ETRR) in December 2008. This online review with open access is free of charge for the readers and the authors. ETRR is independent from ECTRI but the association is the main sponsor of the Review.

ECTRI is very active in European and international interfacing. ECTRI or its members are involved in several activities: ERRAC, ERTRAC, Waterborne Technology Platform and e-Safety forum. ECTRI also maintain permanent links with the European Union representatives and other organisation such as OECD/ITF and the US-Transportation Research Board. ECTRI participates and supports major transport research conferences like ETC, TRA, RS4C, etc... ECTRI's close links with major European Transport Research Organisations led to a common signature of 'the Lyon Declaration' in December 2008 signed by ECTRI, FEHRL, FERSI, ISN VCE, HUMANIST VCE, EURNEX NoE and NEARCTIS NoE. Through this declaration, ECTRI renews its engagement to promote transport research cooperation and its support to the ERA vision.

The goal of the FP6 HUMANIST Network of Excellence (NoE), supported by ECTRI and FERSI, was to promote a Human centred design approach and also to federate research in its scientific domain, by creating a European Virtual Centre. The creation of the virtual centre has been a response to the scattering of research capacities in Europe. This has been done by setting up strong connections between partners inside the NoE. The relationship with Universities and Academic World outside the NoE were not set aside, and were enhanced through training programmes and welcoming young researchers. Outputs from NoE were also targeted toward other relevant stakeholders such as National and European public authorities, Standardisation Bodies, National and European RTD Projects. Diffusion and transfer of knowledge, in addition to common partnerships between NoE and these entities, ensured flow of information in order to disseminate the concept of Human centred design outside the Network. Such a diffusion of information ensured the effectiveness of the expected impacts. The HUMANIST Network of Excellence ended in February 2008 and is now continuing its activities under the status of a Virtual Centre of Excellence created as an international association with four new task forces:

- HUMANIST Road Map Task Force (inputs for FP7 and FP8, ERTRAC, eSafety)
- Task Force "Driver training and ITS"
- Task Force "Long time impact and effect on ITS"
- Task Force "Human error management system to improve road safety".

The HUMANIST VCE members are involved in twelve FP7 projects (DG TREN, DG RTD, DG INFSO).

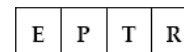

How to get from the Airport

By Bus

You can use the direct bus line No.76. It departs from the Brno Main train station from 04:00 to 23:00 every half an hour. From the Brno Main train station the line 76 goes through the Main Bus Station (it stops near the tram terminus) and continues directly to the final stop at the Airport Brno. The travel time from the centre to the airport is exactly 20 minutes. For one journey you need the 2-zones ticket valid for 60 minutes.

Reconstruction of the railway junction in Brno - Brno EUROPOINT is part of the broader government program to modernize critical hubs and stations in the transit corridor routes, which belongs to the current investment priorities in the development of rail transport in the Czech Republic. Brno railway junction is the second most important in the Czech Republic's rail network, after Prague.

Modern tram depot, two-buildings 240 m long and 35 m wide. In the lower floor are located the premises of daily maintenance, the entire upper deck surface is used for trolleybus parking. In the area is a car wash and also covered by the test track for testing repaired trolleybuses. At present is located there 78 trolleybuses for passenger transport. Types of trolleybuses Skoda 14Tr, 21Tr Skoda, Skoda 22Tr and also new Skoda 25Tr Irisbus.



3. Urban Expressway Tunnel Construction

Tunnel Dobrovskeho I - total length of 1,239 m. It is located almost directly in the path of today's street Dobrovskeho. Embossed part of the length of 1.053 m and boring parts built in construction holes length 134 m and 52 m in Královo Pole. Tunnel Dobrovskeho II - total length of 1,258 m. It is situated about 60 m south from I. Embossed part of the length is 1.060 m.

Technological equipment tunnels complies with the latest European standards requirements (automatically controlled ventilation, monitoring equipment, SOS boxes, camera surveillance, fire-fighting extinguishers).
